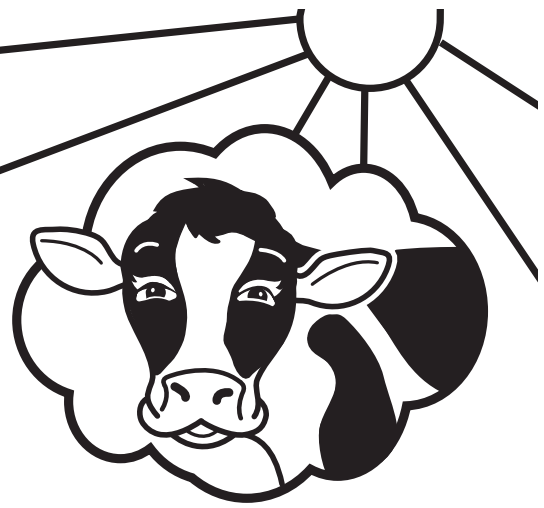

| ① Dairy Farmer | <input type="checkbox"/> a takes care of cows and treats them when they are sick |
| ② Tanker Truck Driver | <input type="checkbox"/> b pasteurizes milk for safety and makes milk into other delicious dairy foods |
| ③ Inspector | <input type="checkbox"/> c teaches people about why it's important to drink milk and eat dairy foods |
| ④ Grocery Store Manager | <input type="checkbox"/> d raises and takes care of cows to produce milk |
| ⑤ Milk Processing Plant Worker | <input type="checkbox"/> e picks up milk from a dairy farm and drives it in a tanker truck to the milk processing plant |
| ⑥ Nutritionist | <input type="checkbox"/> f mixes together cow feed (called TMR, or total mixed ration) for cows to eat |
| ⑦ Herdsman | <input type="checkbox"/> g makes sure milk and other dairy products are kept cold and put on cooler shelves for people to buy |
| ⑧ Registered Dietitian | <input type="checkbox"/> h tests milk to make sure it's safe. Milk is tested and inspected at least three times before it reaches your table |
| ⑨ Veterinarian | <input type="checkbox"/> i keeps track of the cows on a dairy farm |
